Looking Back, Looking Forward

Are you looking back on 2022 with fond memories, or are you breathing a sigh of relief that it's behind you?


Last year, the world saw some significant milestones: the population reached 8 billion; we said goodbye to the Queen of England and Betty White; we held our breath as Russia invaded Ukraine; Maya Angelou became the first Black woman to appear on a U.S. quarter; Top Gun offered a sequel 36 years after the original; and the four most searched words on Google were Facebook, YouTube, Amazon, and Wordle.

The year 2022 offered various challenges for Manna Cafe, due in part to a rocky economy and supply chain disruptions. Most difficult was the passing of our beloved founder and leader, Kenny York. There will never be another Kenny, whose generosity, belly laugh, love for the poor, and chili-making skills will be forever missed. In spite of these challenges,

however, Manna team members continued to do their jobs with excellence.



Here are a few facts we thought you might find interesting: In the past year, Manna Cafe's food distribution team gave away **21,795 boxes of food**. Keep in mind, however, that it's more accurate to say *shopping carts* versus *boxes*, since each client received a cart full of

groceries. Meanwhile,
36,164 hot plates of food
were served at Manna's
community meals. All in all,
Manna Cafe distributed
2,237,294 pounds of food
to Montgomery and Stewart
Counties!



Manna also continued to offer all its other services: the culinary internship program; case work; mobile pantries; weekly showers; health clinics; Manna Mini Meals; distribution of clothing, household items, school supplies, and diapers; youth nutrition education; food rescue; inter-agency support and collaboration; and emergency warming and cooling centers. There were **59 nights** when the temperature dropped below freezing and our staff and volunteers welcomed the homeless (40 per night on average) into the center to spend the night, enjoy hot meals, do laundry, take showers, and more.

In November, we launched a brand-new program, Our Chance (funded by the State of TN). It's designed to improve low-income families' economic mobility and well-being by providing wraparound services and case work support. Countless children will benefit from this endeavor.

In summary, Manna Cafe served **more than 28,000 people** in 2022— and many of them received multiple services. It was a very fruitful year, and we're optimistic about 2023 as we steward the gift that Kenny left to us.

Here's to a year of service founded on love and a commitment to excellence.

And here's to the future.
