Manna Café was founded on the very simple idea that sharing the love of Christ starts with sharing good food. Kenny always stressed you cannot feed the soul until you fill the stomach. Such a simple concept is the foundation of the Manna Culinary Internship program. The knowledgeable management team trains, coaches, and develops candidates for approximately six months before they earn a highly regarded ServSafe certification. Additionally, interns receive a weekly stipend.

Beyond instruction in skills, interns find support and encouragement from dedicated Manna staff members that truly offer participants real hope for the future and the opportunity to make changes in their life circumstances.

Robert, the newest intern, hails from California and has traveled through different communities before landing in Clarksville. He was first a client at Manna Café and, after meeting several staff members, he began volunteering in warehouse operations and various areas of the Refuge. One Saturday morning at the breakfast meal, Manna's kitchen manager, Rita Stinson, offered Robert a position in the internship program. "Robert is a great asset. He works hard and does whatever is needed," explains Rita.

Dana became homeless last May. She has struggled with many issues in the past year including substance abuse, domestic violence, and incarceration. Dana sought out food and other services at Manna Café and found what she describes as "her angel."

Manna Henoes Giving beyond the call of duty

The Manna Clothing Ministry has been busy helping families settle into new homes. While way beyond the

scope of their ministry, these volunteers have taken the art of giving to a new level by collecting and moving household goods for three families in one week.





A Lot Got Done Last Month

Due to the generosity of our donors, Manna Cafe provided Montgomery and Stewart County residents with:

- 3,059 hot meals at our Mobile Cafe locations
 - · 2,098 carts of food
 - 1,461 pounds of clothing
- 6,778 pounds of household goods
- 3,642 pounds of clothing (donated to other agencies)
 - 80 hot showers for the homeless
 - · case work benefits for 60 clients
 - free clinic services for 30 people
