The outpouring of donations of food, clothing, and volunteers has been nothing short of miraculous. "I know why Tennessee is called the Volunteer State," commented Rita Stinson, Manna Cafe kitchen manager. "The generosity has been amazing."

Additionally, community groups, agencies, and churches have worked together, sharing donations to make sure needs are met.

Manna Cafe was able to provide emergency accommodations at our Refuge for the first night and hot meals every night after the disaster. Clothing and household items were available to those displaced.

Acts of kindness and support also came from outside the Montgomery County area.














Beyond the many donations of food and other resources, Manna Cafe was blessed by an overwhelming number of volunteers who were eager to help.
